





On this Fourth Sunday of Advent, the Gospel from Saint Matthew reminds us that our God is a God of surprises. Just when Joseph was ready to call it quits with Mary, the angel of the Lord appears to Joseph allaying his fears to not be afraid to take Mary into his home as it is through the Holy Spirit that Mary has conceived the child. Furthermore the angel instructs Joseph that the name of the child is to be "Jesus."

What we can learn from the Gospel today is the importance of how and when God is calling us, through our active relationship with God in prayer and our attentive and meditative reading of the Sacred Scriptures, both of which should be our daily pattern for the well-being of our spiritual lives.

Through our baptism we have each been called by name to become Emmanuel – to become Jesus for others through the example we live and through the actions of our lives which are to be modeled in the ways we strive to embody the values of the Gospel not being afraid to live the gift of our Catholic faith. As we continue these final days of our Advent spiritual journey toward Bethlehem, may we ensure that we make every effort to see Jesus in others and that they in turn can see and experience Jesus in us.

The projected costs to replace several parts essential to the longevity of the church bells system is approximately \$15,000.




