



On Monday of this past week the Church celebrated the Baptism of Jesus. Jesus' baptism was an act of Him uniting more fully with us, taking the next step. He is already united to us as a human, now He unites with us in our sinfulness. He did not sin, but he takes on the baptism of repentance with us. John the Baptist's baptism was a sign of washing ourselves clean and beginning a new life, repenting for our wrongs. Jesus had nothing to repent for, yet he did this sign with us to show us that He has come to help us wash ourselves. Once Jesus died and rose and the Holy Spirit descended on the Apostles, Baptism became sacramental and not just a sign. During our Baptism we take baptismal promises, or we accept them for a baby and help them live them out. This is a good time for us to see if we are living out our own Baptismal promises and helping our children and godchildren to do so. Do you know your Baptismal date?

Now that the Church has brought to conclusion the season of Christmas, we enter into the period of the liturgical season of Ordinary Time until the season of Lent which begins on Ash Wednesday, February 22, 2023.

Ordinary Time is marked with green vestments that the priest and deacon wear at Mass. In our Catholic tradition, the color green symbolizes the virtue of hope as we find new life in Christ.

On January 1st, we began a New Year of God's grace which speaks of new beginnings and offers us the opportunity for a fresh start. Any type of resolutions to become better people have to begin with Christ, especially when it involves our lives of faith. If we really want to change our lives, then we have to call upon our Lord for His Divine Assistance and Help.
