





The Fifth Week of Lent: This week is filled with drama. We continue to prepare ourselves to be open to God's graces. We continue to try to choose Lent, to act Lent, in very concrete ways. We are examining our patterns and realigning our priorities. Our hearts are being renewed, as we experience God's reconciling love and beg for the gift of healing.

Like parishes across the Diocese of Greensburg, we are attempting to meet our **Diocesan DLA goals.** Here are the latest DLA results for our Partner Parishes: St. Martin has a total of \$13,586 from 52 gifts and pledges and at 99.5% of their goal of \$13,600. St. Joseph has a total \$14,376 from 61 gifts and pledges and at 63 % of their goal of \$22,834. Please note that anything over and beyond the diocesan goal returns back to our parishes and will be appropriated to the respective Case Statement of each parish. Many thanks to all who have willingly offered to participate in the campaign so far. The participation of each household is critical to the success of the DLA. We really do need everyone's support.

New Pastoral Council Update

Grandparents Raising Grandchildren Hosts Monthly Meetings

An increasing number of grandparents are unexpectedly thrust into the role of being the primary caregiver for children in need of family members (other than their parents) to provide a home due to opioid abuse, alcoholism, incarceration, divorce, child abuse or other reasons. One in 10 grandparents (often on fixed incomes) have been the primary support of a grandchild at some time in their lives. Pennsylvania ranks seventh among the 50 states in terms of number of children, age newborn to adolescent, living in grandparent-headed households. Our churches are concerned and are putting our faith into action through Grandparents Raising Grandchildren, an ecumenical social outreach mission of St. Cecilia Parish, Whitney, Sacred Heart Parish, Youngstown, and Trinity Lutheran Church, Latrobe.
