



Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia! Christ is Risen!

Throughout Lent embracing the spiritual disciplines of this season in our lives of prayer, fasting, and charitable works, we have journeyed with the Church to grow closer to Christ through his passion, suffering, and death which has led us to the celebration of the Resurrection of Christ from the dead.

The Good News of the Gospel is that the tomb of death could not hold the Lord of Life! For all of us gathered in church today, we too may find ourselves from time to time in some tombs. Jesus wants to raise us from the tombs that we can sometimes find ourselves in – it may be the tomb of fear about what the future holds for us. It may be the tomb of confusion about where life is taking us and where we may feel the world seems to be going. It may be the tomb of resentment because of hurt received from others. It may be the tomb of despair about difficult relationships with family members, friends, co-workers or neighbors and the uncertainty of how to overcome it. This is why the Easter message of the Gospel is so important for us!

Through his resurrection, Jesus wants to give us the ability to rise from the tombs that can take hold of us. The Gospel message we receive and need to hear repeated again and again echoes hope that no tomb can hold us because of the love Christ has for each of us.

The Easter candle is a symbol of the Risen Christ, who is our source of all our courage, hope, and love. We cannot reduce the energizing flame of faith to the flickering flame of a candle. The fire of faith must refine our values and be the test of our lifestyles. It must inspire all whose lives we touch. The season of Easter is a time to fan the flame of our Catholic faith into an inferno that will burn away fear and selfishness and enflame our hearts with greater love of God and one another. As Easter people, we cannot settle for anything less!

On behalf of the members of the Partner Parish Staff, and in my own name, Deacon Drew and I express to each of you and your families a very blessed and Happy Easter! May the 50 days of the season of Easter be filled with the blessings of the Risen Lord in your lives of faith!
