

The recent First Communion ceremonies at our Partner Churches serve as our annual reminder to each one of us, of what a big deal it is to be able to receive the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Sacrament. For some of us, it has been many years since our "first" Communion. And when you do something as often as we Catholics do when we go to Communion, we must be very careful not to trivialize what we get to do each time that we come to Mass. It is an honor and a privilege for us to be able to go to Holy Communion. We don't want to

ever just get up, jump in line, and come down the aisle and receive Jesus, AND NOT be fully conscious and aware of just what we are doing. The children's preparation, devotion, excitement, and awe-inspiring love for Jesus as they make their First Communion has got to inspire all of us to a greater love for the Eucharist for ourselves. We've got to see how important this is. We've got to re-commit ourselves and our lives and our time to coming to Mass EVERY week. In the same vein, why not try to go to Mass during the week? We've got to serve Jesus in serving our brothers and sisters. These were powerful weekends for all of us, if we let it be! Maybe it's time for all of us to think back to our own First Communions. Tell your kids and your grand-kids about your own First Communions. We need to ask our older kids what they remember from their First Communions, even if it's only been a few years. These are neat discussions to have as a family. By sharing our Faith with one another, we are really BUILDING our Faith together.

The month of May is especially dedicated to our Blessed Mother and it is the occasion for a moving tribute of faith and love which Catholics in every part of the world pay tribute to the Queen of Heaven. The Christian custom of dedicating the month of May to the Blessed Virgin arose at the end of the 13th century. The Blessed Virgin Mary is the Mother of the Church and therefore the example, as well as the guide and inspiration, of everyone who, in and through the Church seeks to be the servant of God and one another and an obedient agent of the promptings of the Holy Spirit.

This year, May Crowning celebrations are being planned at each of our Partner Churches. These are Parish events and ALL ARE INVITED...children, siblings, Moms and Dads, all parishioners! Our world is such desperate need of a Mother. St. Joseph & St. Martin, pray for us.

This is going to be a great month. It's already a little warmer. The days are longer.

of our commitment to providing a safe environment. Some folks WANT to do more for the parish but find the idea of getting clearances daunting. We might envision complicated forms, long waits in line, and such. Actually, obtaining clearances is QUICK and EASY. All parishioners over the age of 18 who wish to help out at Parish functions, who have direct or any possible contact with children or the ability to do so, need to complete the following requirements: The following clearances are required by PA law include: signing an FBI fingerprinting waiver (if you have lived in PA for the past 10 years) or getting fingerprinted, PA Criminal History Check and PA Child Abuse Clearance. Diocesan requirements include: Mandatory Reporter Training, VIRTUS training and signing the Diocesan Code of Pastoral Conduct form. We value all our volunteers and are committed to providing support to ensure that we meet this requirement and ensure a safe environment for our children. If you have any questions, please contact the parish office as soon as possible. If you do not have proper clearances according to the Diocese of Greensburg, you will not be permitted to volunteer. CLEARANCE REQUIREMENTS

The Diocese of Greensburg requires all volunteers to have all of the following clearances and trainings prior to work or ministry in the diocese.†

Diocesan Code of Pastoral Conduct

PA Mandated Reporter Training *

VIRTUS Training

PA Criminal History Check Form - Every Five Years

PA Child Abuse Form - Every Five Years

New volunteers could use the affidavit so long as they have had a continual connection with the parish and have maintained a residence in PA for 10 years. Thus a move out of the parish or the State for over one year would require a new FBI Clearance to be obtained.

<u>FBI Fingerprint Check</u> - Every Five Years. **Initial submission must be done through screening agency.**

Then every five years screening agency submission **OR** an <u>Affidavit for volunteers only</u> ‡.

All clearances listed above, as required by the state of Pennsylvania, are **valid for a period of five years**, and must be renewed prior to the five-year expiration date in order to be able to continue employment, or to volunteer.

Clearance renewal forms for volunteers are available in the office or may be obtained online. (See Attached Forms)

Virtus Training is required to anyone who has not done this training previously. It is offered online through the Diocese website. There is also a recommended refresher course available online.
