

The days are getting longer, the pollen count is astronomical, and, at least for the time being, the Pirates are filling me with hope - spring is clearly here. Of course, spring also brings with it everyone's favorite time me of year: construction season. Our parishes are not exempt from this wonderful time, and I wanted to inform you of a few major projects that will be happening over the next couple of months.

The first is the **St Martin Social Hall Church roof**. Quite simply, the roof has reached the end of its useful life and needs a full replacement. As a result of the extremely high winds effecting our region, the church social hall sustained significant roof damage and an insurance claim was submitted to the diocese. We have been working with the diocesan Facilities Management Office to develop a plan for a total replacement. The cost for the entire replacement for the roof of the social hall will be covered through insurance. While I was initially informed that rectory roof would also be included under the claim such is not the case. Therefore, we will use the limited funds offered by the insurance carrier and replace any damaged shingles on the rectory roof. At some point in the future, the rectory roof will in fact need to be replaced but we have time to figure that out.

In addition, the frames of the **Church windows** are in needed repair and will have to be completely stripped and repainted to ensure longevity. Bids are currently being taken and we want to tackle this maintenance project sooner than later. Therefore, a decision was made to prioritize using the Diocesan Lenten Appeal refund monies to go towards the repainting all of the church window frames rather than repair the church Bell.

Congratulations on our newest Knights of Columbus members; Parishioners Kerry Campbell and Michael Knott received their 3rd Degrees Exemplifications at St. Martin's.

I will taking a partial stay vacation from May 8-12. The weekday Masses will be canceled.

Congratulations to each of our Partner Parishes for making and surpassing their respective diocesan DLA goals this year. We are grateful for the generous spirit of generosity of all the parishioners who supported the DLA campaign and made is a definite success.

I am truly grateful for the many Easter cards and gifts I received throughout the Easter season. I am grateful and humbled by your many kindnesses to me personally.

CLEARANCE REQUIREMENTS

The Diocese of Greensburg requires all volunteers to have all of the following clearances and trainings prior to work or ministry in the diocese.†

Diocesan Code of Pastoral Conduct

PA Mandated Reporter Training *

VIRTUS Training

PA Criminal History Check Form - Every Five Years

PA Child Abuse Form - Every Five Years

New volunteers could use the affidavit so long as they have had a continual connection with the parish and have maintained a residence in PA for 10 years. Thus a move out of the parish or the State for over one year would require a new FBI Clearance to be obtained.

<u>FBI Fingerprint Check</u> - Every Five Years. **Initial submission must be done through screening agency.**

Then every five years screening agency submission **OR** an Affidavit for volunteers only ‡.

All clearances listed above, as required by the state of Pennsylvania, are **valid for a period of five years**, and must be renewed prior to the five-year expiration date in order to be able to continue employment, or to volunteer.

Clearance renewal forms for volunteers are available in the office or may be obtained online. (See Attached Forms)

Virtus Training is required to anyone who has not done this training previously. It is offered online through the Diocese website. There is also a recommended refresher course available online.
