

# Mary, Queen of the Holy Rosary

Archbishop Fulton Sheen once wrote, "The Rosary is the book of the blind, where souls see and there enact the greatest drama of love the world has even known; it is the book of the simple, which initiates them into mysteries and knowledge more satisfying than the education of other men; it is the book of the aged whose eyes close upon the shadow of this world, and open on the substance of the next. The power of the Rosary is beyond description."

We cherish these inspiring words from the beloved Archbishop as we begin October, dedicated to Our Blessed Mother, and celebrate one of her feast days on Oct. 7, Our Lady of the Rosary.

The use of "prayer beads" and repeated recitation of prayers to aid in meditation come from the earliest days of the Church, and even has roots in pre-Christian times. Long strings of beads were used in monasteries and nunneries, and even by lay persons, to keep count of the numbers of prayers being said. According to some Catholic traditions, the Rosary was given to St. Dominic in a vision of our Blessed Mother in 1214.

The Rosary we use today begins with the Apostles' Creed, the Our Father, three Hail Mary's and a Glory Be, followed by five decades, each consisting of an Our Father, 10 Hail Mary's and a Glory Be. It concludes with the Salve Regina (Hail Holy Queen).

Each decade of the Rosary is accompanied by reflection on one of the Mysteries: Joyful, Sorrowful, Glorious or Luminous. (The Luminous Mysteries were introduced by St. John Paul II in 2002.) We focus on events in the lives of Jesus Christ and His Blessed Mother. We also concentrate on the promises of Christ, God who humbly takes on human flesh to share in our humanity. The Rosary helps us meditate and come to appreciate more fully the birth, the suffering, the death and the resurrection, and the miracles of His life while He was with us here on earth.

# **CLEARANCE REQUIREMENTS**

The Diocese of Greensburg requires all volunteers to have all of the following clearances and trainings prior to work or ministry in the diocese.<sup>+</sup>

<u>Diocesan Code of Pastoral Conduct</u> <u>PA Mandated Reporter Training</u> \* <u>VIRTUS Training</u> <u>PA Criminal History Check Form</u> - Every Five Years <u>PA Child Abuse Form</u> - Every Five Years

New volunteers could use the affidavit so long as they have had a continual connection with the parish and have maintained a residence in PA for 10 years. Thus a move out of the parish or the State for over one year would require a new FBI Clearance to be obtained.

# <u>FBI Fingerprint Check</u> - Every Five Years. Initial submission must be done through screening agency.

Then every five years screening agency submission OR an Affidavit for volunteers only ‡.

All clearances listed above, as required by the state of Pennsylvania, are **valid for a period of five years**, and must be renewed prior to the five-year expiration date in order to be able to continue employment, or to volunteer.

Clearance renewal forms for volunteers are available in the office or may be obtained online. (See Attached Forms)

Virtus Training is required to anyone who has not done this training previously. It is offered online through the Diocese website. There is also a recommended refresher course available online.
