The fifty days of the glorious season of Easter are brought to conclusion as the Church celebrates the **Solemni-ty of Pentecost** this weekend. Pentecost is often called the Birthday of the Church. This wonderful feast celebrates the fulfillment of the promise of Jesus to send the Advocate – the Holy Spirit – on the infant Church assembled in the Upper Room.

The disciples were filled with fear that they, too, might be arrested and executed like Jesus. When the Holy Spirit came upon them in the strong, driving wind and tongues of fire, the fear the disciples had abated and they began to boldly proclaim the Gospel. The presence of the Holy Spirit enabled them to master their fear and become greater witnesses to spreading the Good News.

Jesus told his disciples that they are to go forth to spread the Gospel message to the world. Evangelization, sharing our faith with others is one of the signs that the Holy Spirit is alive and active in our lives. We are called to reach out and bring the saving news of our Catholic faith to others by the way we live, by our example, and by the excitement with which we share our Catholic faith in conversation.

It is a constant challenge in our lives to keep our hearts open to the **Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit: Wisdom, Understanding, Knowledge, Counsel, Fortitude, Piety and Fear of the Lord**. We also need to foster the Fruits of the Holy Spirit into our daily living: Charity, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Gentleness, Generosity, Fidelity, Modesty, Self-Control and Chastity.

On this Pentecost Sunday, we thank God for the gift of the Holy Spirit, who works in countless ways to deepen our faith, fill us with strength and inspiration, and to renew our lives! Come Holy Spirit!.

Memorial Day – is on Monday May 29th. Why not consider coming to daily Mass to thank God for the freedoms we often take for granted in our lives? We thank God every day for the men and women who have given their lives while serving in the United States Armed Forces.
