



Personal relationship with Jesus? That doesn't sound Catholic to me...and VERY Protestant. If you are like me and were raised in a typical Catholic atmosphere, a "personal relationship" with the Lord is NOT something you might have been comfortable talking about with another person. As Catholics, we can at times be creatures of habit, and as a result, our own worst enemies. We attempt to get people to join our Church, yet we aren't able to articulate in our own words what we REALLY believe. We ask what these other Mega Churches have that we don't, yet we don't SPEAK to anyone when they come in the door. We say we want more youth involvement, yet we aren't willing to change AT ALL. Well I am here to tell you that, spoiler alert, a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and the term New Evangelization is NOT anything new at all in the Catholic realm. In fact, Pope John Paul II said that "Sometimes even Catholics have lost or NEVER HAD the chance to experience Christ personally; not Christ as mere 'paradigm' or 'value', but as the living Lord, 'the way, the truth, and the life." That reality should make us VERY SAD. We cannot assume that just because someone is sitting in our pews that they have made Christ the Lord of their life. As a result, we are called to spread the good news; to evangelize! Pope Paul VI in 1975 said that "The Church exists in order to evangelize." These words of Pope Paul VI remind us that evangelization is central to the identity and mission of the Church in the world. Evangelization is also central to the identity and mission of EVERY Christian. To evangelize is to bear witness in a simple and direct way that "God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but might have eternal life" (John 3:16). By virtue of Baptism EVERY Christian is called to bear witness (in words and in deeds) to the truth and beauty of faith in Christ Jesus. "No believer in Christ, no institution of the Church can avoid this supreme duty to proclaim Christ to all the peoples!"-John Paul II. "It is then necessary to awaken again in believers a full relationship with Christ, mankind's ONLY Savior. ONLY from a personal relationship with Jesus can an effective evangelization on develop"-John Paul II. The truth of the matter is, all of our efforts as Church are completely meaningless if they don't have conversion at the center. Conversion means "accepting, by a personal decision, the saving sovereignty of Christ and becoming His disciple." –JPII. So what does the Catholic Church need that it doesn't already possess? Absolutely NOTHING!! We HAVE Jesus Christ, we HAVE new life in Him through His Saving act on the Cross, and we HAVE the Eucharist (the body, blood, soul and Divinity of Jesus). WE truly HAVE IT ALL. We lack nothing but at times the openness to actually share this good news with others in joy. If you have never done so, consider praying a prayer of commitment. A prayer of commitment simply means that you have come to believe in the person of Jesus Christ and want Him to be the Lord of your life. This particular prayer of commitment is used in a Catholic Evangelical series known as ChristLife... A Prayer of Commitment Lord God, Please forgive me for all the things I have done wrong. I turn to you and turn away from sin. [Pause. Silently ask forgiveness for anything you know is keeping you from God.] Jesus, please be the center of my life. I welcome you personally as Lord and Savior of my life. I ask you, Holy Spirit, to fill me and empower me to live as a [son or a daughter] of God. I want to have your grace to truly live a new life. Thank you for hearing my prayer through Christ our Lord. Amen. (Content attributed to Mary Sampey, Director of Parish Formation and Discipleship, Monroeville, Penn Hills & Pitcairn


#### "Living the Eucharist Like the Saints"
